

Medholdings CEO Elected to Georgia University's Board of Trustees

Mercer University's Board of Trustees announced recently that it has elected Milton L. Cruz, chairman, president and CEO of Medholdings in the De Mercadeo sector of Guaynabo, to serve a five-year term on the Macon, Ga. school's governing body.

Cruz earned his bachelor of arts degree from Mercer, a master's degree from Georgetown University School of Law, a Juris Doctor from Boston Uni-
